

## PLEASE CUT ALONG LINES

### HOME

- This animal makes its den in an enlarged rabbit burrow, badger set or among rocks in mountains.
  - Increasingly common in urban areas.
  - This animal marks its boundaries with scent to claim its own territory.
- 

### HOME

- This animal is found in greatest numbers in the Highlands. There is seasonal movement from open moorlands above the treeline in summer, to sheltered valleys in winter.
- 

### HOME

This animal makes its home in:

- Deciduous woods, less numerous amongst conifers.
  - Found in parks and gardens.
  - Nest a drey of twigs with leaves attached, in a tree fork or hollow tree.
- 

### HOME

This bird nests in:

- Trees.
  - On sea cliffs.
  - Also in towns on buildings.
- 

### HOME

- Usually found in woodland or among rocks in hills.
  - This animal makes its home in a 'home' or 'sett' – an extensive network of tunnels with numerous entrances heaped with piles of earth, some fresh and in current use.

### HOME

- This animal can be found mainly on farmland.
  - This animal makes its nest in hedge bottoms.

HOME

- This animal digs tunnels for nesting with a food store nearby.
  - Widespread in:
    - Open woodland
    - Hedgerows
    - Plantations
    - Rural gardens

HOME

- This animal lives in holes in the soil, under logs and is usually hidden by day.
- 

HOME

- This animal lives in workable soil, especially on farmland.
  - Hill or fortress may be turf-covered and contain nesting chamber.
- 

HOME

- Lives above ground in open country such as fields and downs.
  - Sits in hollow or 'form'.
